From the Pastor...

“To Thee Our First Fruits Give...”

The fall months are traditionally the time for churches to focus on stewardship. This is partly because the harvest season reminds us of the ancient injunction to give the first fruits of the harvest to the One who made it grow.

(Practically speaking, it’s also when many churches are planning for the next year’s budget while also feeling the pinch of the summertime “slump” in giving.)

This is not the case for Grace. Having re-aligned our Fiscal Year, we now have our formal focus on stewardship during the Springtime. Nevertheless, it is *always* a good time to talk about stewardship—winter, spring, summer or fall—because while we use the pledge cards to help frame our budget, it remains true that

stewardship is not about the budget. It's about **faithfulness**.

So that means I have the privilege to write about stewardship this fall without all the paperwork and programming. I also have the privilege of talking about stewardship during a time when our financial picture looks remarkably healthy, considering the economic climate in which we live. If stewardship were all about the budget, we could leave it alone for a while. But it's not.

As many of you already know, I learned everything I know about stewardship from my Dad. He worked in insurance and finance, and he also was the perpetual chair of the Stewardship Team at my home congregation. While he was gracious enough to encourage people to give in whatever way they were able or accustomed, he was also courageous enough to invite people to follow the biblical model that he learned and practiced at home. As his children, my brother and I learned this and were essentially obligated to follow suit.

From the moment I began earning an allowance, my Dad taught me to put 10% directly into the offering envelope, 10% into a savings account, and then carefully budget the remaining 80% for whatever I wanted or needed to purchase. Of course, with my miniscule income, none of my offerings had any real impact on the budget of the church—but again, that's not the point.

Learning from my Dad about “first-fruits” giving taught me a life lesson that continues to enrich me and my family today. No matter what my financial picture looks like, in every season of my life I have had the privilege of seeing God show up in my pocketbook—the first line-item in my household budget is a monthly reminder that all that I am and all that I have are mine belong not to me, but to the One who made me.

I'm not proud of my record of giving (although I am very proud of my Dad for passing this vital lesson onto his children). I'm grateful for the opportunity to be reminded that God has richly blessed me with a variety of gifts, and it is a privilege to share them with the commu-

nity that bears Christ's Name.

I have also had the opportunity to support various other organizations or special offerings (what church folk call “second mile” giving), but the first 10% goes to the church, where God's people work to make Christ known in the world.

Has the church always made perfect choices with how to use the gifts I've given? Surely not. We had some pastors in my home church who were less than thrilling. Sometimes the property folks made poor choices. Often the worship planning team picked hymns that I couldn't bear to sing. But that's not the point.

The lesson my father taught me was a lesson about giving up the illusion of “control.” “My money” was never “mine” in the first place. “My life,” since being washed in the waters of baptism, is not “mine” at all. By God's grace, my life has been gathered into Christ's Body—which means that no matter what happens to me or my finances, I will rest secure in a holy promise: “You are Mine.” And thanks be to God for that.
