From the Pastor / Personnel Updates

“Stories to Tell. Gifts to Share”

We are a people of story. From the moment we begin to speak, our lives are grounded not in fleeting moments of disconnected urges and needs, but in stories: We know who we are because we know where we came from. We know where we are headed because we know where we are. Ann and I have recently been watching *Who Do You Think You Are?* on NBC, the second season of a show about famous people researching their ancestries—traveling around the world to discover who they are by knowing where they come from.

In the months to come, we are beginning a new conversation at Grace called “Stories to Tell. Gifts to Share.” It is a new stewardship resource—but it is about much more than filling out a pledge card or writing checks. It’s about telling our stories—as individuals, households, and as the people of God.

I am convinced that as faithful people learn to tell their stories, amazing things happen. We become more aware of all the great things God has done for us. We become comfortable sharing that good news with people who need to hear it. And we begin to live more graciously and generously, responding to the movements of Grace in our lives by connecting more and more of who we are to the One who gave us life and breath, the world and all that is in it.

More on this will follow in the months to come. In the meantime, I offer two invitations:

1. Take some time to reflect on the last couple of weeks. Turn your TODO list and your day-planner into a story: Where was God active in your life? How did you touch the lives of others? How are we touching the lives of others together through our ministry together? Learn to tell your story. Having trouble? Give me a call and we’ll work on your stories together.

2. Join me in helping Grace grow into a story-telling, gift-sharing, gracious and even more generous people. **Join me on Sunday, March 6, after the 10:30am worship service** to find out how you can help. All are welcome!

Update on Office Restructuring

Shortly after the Parish Administrator position was eliminated, the Council discovered that churches (and thus, church employees) are exempt from Unemployment tax and ineligible for Unemployment Compensation. As a result, on February 22, Council revised the separation agreement for Laurel Rose to include an additional two weeks of full compensation. Together with the \$545 collected for a cash gift, Grace has now provided \$1,998 to Laurel during this time of transition. Contact Mary Gieschen or Pr Jay if you have any questions.

Sunday School News

From Brooke Obregon

On February 6, our Sunday school kids began a new rotation on the Apostle Paul. Paul is extremely important in the history and life of the church. He authored a large portion of the New Testament. We want our children to learn about Paul.

Our Objectives are to:

1. Identify Paul as one of the key leaders in the history of the early church
2. Recognize that Paul speaks to us today through his writings.
3. Learn more about the kind of person Paul was by studying select episodes in his life.
4. Become acquainted with two well known quotes/examples from Paul's writings.

Each week, we will be studying a different portion of Paul's life. The different lessons are:

Road to Damascus, Over the Wall and Beyond – In *Acts 9* we learn about Paul's dramatic conversion to Christianity and how he sets off to preach the Gospel.

Paul: Founder of Churches In *Acts 16* we join Paul in Philippi where he starts a congregation that meets in the home of Lydia, a wealthy merchant. Paul reached out to all kinds of people. *Galatians 3:28* will be included in the lesson. Question topics: What is a church family? Who is included in the church family?

Paul the Theologian In *1 Corinthians 12* Paul compares the church and a human body - both having many parts. We are going to have some fun with this comparison to make the point that all in the church are one body through baptism so everyone is in it together. Question topics: What is an epistle? Why did Paul write letters? To whom did he write them? Why do we listen to Paul's letters today?

Paul the Unsinkable We will use the shipwreck story found in *Acts 27 & 28* as an example of Paul's dramatic adventures. We will emphasize Paul's control of the situation and the source of this confidence.

In February, the Reconciling in Christ working group met to consider the “now what” of our re-affirmed commitment to being a welcoming place. In addition to giving

thanks for the Congregation's strong support of our RIC status at its January Meeting, we discussed several ways of moving forward as a house for all:

* **Publicity:** We are looking for ways to spread the word about our welcome—in the *News Graphic*, in LGBT-friendly publications and community networks, and by word of mouth.

* **Policy:** We recommended that the Council consider how to celebrate same-gender relationships at Grace.

* **Youth/schools:** We are looking for ways for Grace to be active in youth education and the M-T school system in promoting diversity and combating bullying and exclusion.

The Greater Milwaukee Synod held its annual Mission of Healing in El Salvador February 5-12. Rip McManus was part of the delegation, which served over 1,000 people in the south-central and northern micro-regions of the Salvadoran Lutheran Synod. The synod plans to expand into the eastern micro-region, which includes Mi



Buen Jesús, in 2012. Grace contributed reading glasses and markers, part of nearly

a half ton of supplies carried to El Salvador by the synod delegation.

Markers were used in the children's activity areas, along with coffee filters and pipe cleaners, to make butterflies. Coffee filters were colored, then sprayed with water to allow the colors to bleed. A pipe cleaner wrapped around the end product turned the children's artwork into a butterfly, mascot of the Salvadoran synod's current “No to Violence, Yes to Life” campaign.



Reading glasses are greatly appreciated in El Salvador, where their cost is outside the reach of many of the country's poor. One grateful recipient remarked that they'd now be able to read their Bible again for the first time in years.

Although not participants in the mission this year, Pastor Julio and his ministry team were still able to meet with Rip during a free morning mid-week, where they shared in our Super Bowl celebration.



“Growing in Grace”: Walking with a Hungry World

During the season of Lent, we will again focus on hunger, but this time through the lens of caring for creation. Creation is God’s first gift to the world—a gift we so often take for granted—and the use and abuse of the earth is clearly connected to the ability of the peoples of the earth to live free of hunger and thirst. Limited access to clean water and sustainable agriculture are two of the greatest threats to people living in poverty—in Southeast Wisconsin and around the world. And since we’re all on this planet together, our own relationship with the earth is inseparable from the plight of the poor of the earth whose lives are threatened by food and water crises on a daily basis.



And so, we will be working together toward a deeper understanding of God’s gift of creation—and how God gives us the grace to “grow”: to grow in grace, to grow in faith, to grow in justice, to grow in a life-giving relationship with the earth and all its inhabitants. Here are some of the many opportunities to “Grow”:

Sunday School: Creation Rotation

The Sunday School kids (PreK-6th) will be learning about God’s first gift, Creation.

Sunday Adult Forum: Creation

Adults will journey through the wonders of God’s creation and the ways God calls us into a caring, grace-filled relationship with the earth.

Sunday Confirmation Class: Easter Vigil

The Confirmation students will be preparing to tell some of God’s greatest stories of bringing life into a dying world during the Easter Vigil

Worship Arts: Growing in Grace

The Worship Arts group is preparing a congregational art installation that explores what God is “growing” in us during this season.

Seeds of Grace

Beginning on Ash Wednesday, we will be planting seeds that will grow in our homes and around the baptismal font as a tangible reminder of God’s gift of growth and life.

World Hunger Giving

Our youth and children will be saving up all during Lent for a generous offering to the World Hunger Appeal. Adults in the congregation are invited to **match** their giving—100%, 10%, 200%. Whatever you think is possible for you. The opportunity to commit to this match will be included in the bulletins during the first weeks of Lent. Contact the office if you’d like to join in!

On Easter Sunday, we will take a **second offering** for the World Hunger in which all are welcome to give generously to this worthy cause. Then we’ll let the kids decide which water and agriculture projects to support with all the money raised. Last year, we raised over \$6,000 for World Hunger during Lent. Let’s see if we can beat it this year!

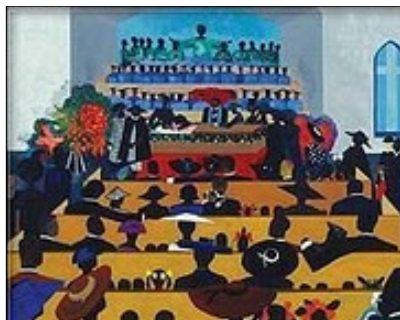
Planted and Watered, Nourished to Grow: Baptism and Holy Communion

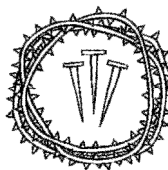
Maundy Thursday—April 21 7pm

Good Friday—April 22 2pm and 7pm

A simple service at 2pm is followed by an evening service with the **Passion according to John**, a beautiful **prayer for the whole world**, and the **procession and adoration of the cross**.



Easter Vigil—Saturday, April 23 6pm

We gather around a **fire** to light the Easter candle and process into the church with **candles**; we hear ancient **stories** of deliverance (some acted out by our youth and children); we celebrate **Holy Baptism**; we ring **bells** (led by the kids) and proclaim the resurrection; and we celebrate **Holy Communion**. And then—we have a party afterward!
